



Department of Economics Lecturer/Academic Program Associate Position Announcement

The Department of Economics at the University of Kansas invites qualified instructors with a record of excellence in teaching introductory economics courses to apply to 2 non-tenure track positions of Lecturer/Academic Program Associate (hereafter “lecturers”). The chosen candidates will join a team of dedicated educators. These positions require the lecturers to teach an average of three sections per semester, with a focus on undergraduate courses on the principles of microeconomics and macroeconomics, which involve the supervision of teaching assistants. These positions also offer the opportunity to teach other courses. The appointment is for one academic year, beginning on January 1, 2019, and is a limited-term appointment, with the possibility of renewal upon annual evaluation.



The Department of Economics has an internationally recognized faculty and a long tradition of excellence in undergraduate education. Our Oswald Program in Economics, which represents the undergraduate program, consists of more than 350 undergraduate majors and offers students the ability to earn Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of General Studies, or Bachelor of Science degrees. Undergraduate students receive training in macroeconomics, microeconomics, and econometrics as part of their core education. Graduates of the Oswald Program in Economics are successful in industry, academia, and government. Historic Snow Hall, which houses the department, contains state-of-the-art classrooms, lecture spaces, computer labs, and other facilities.
